



Your task for the Mystery Improvisation challenge is to prepare and perform a short sketch which is **between 5 to 7 minutes long.** There must be a minimum of three (3) students taking part in the sketch.

The topic is:

Write & perform a modern fairy tale. Your fairy tale must include a message for the audience. You also must include some elements of the hero's journey below



You will have up to 3 hours to prepare for your sketch. A member of staff will take you to your preparation space where you will find a kit to produce basic props. All made props must be handed over to a member of staff at the performance venue. In addition to the props you decide to make, there will be these items available to you on stage:

- ♦ a chair
- a pair of wooden sticks
- a pair of sunglasses
- a bowler hat
- a sward
- a Genie lamp
- ♦ maracas

The judging criteria for the performance are

- reflection and insight
- accuracy of language
- fluency of language
- Pronunciation
- overall entertainment factor

In each category you can score a maximum of 8 points.

Penalties apply to:

- time limits
- not following the competition brief above

The running order of performing teams will be drawn randomly.
