Facilities

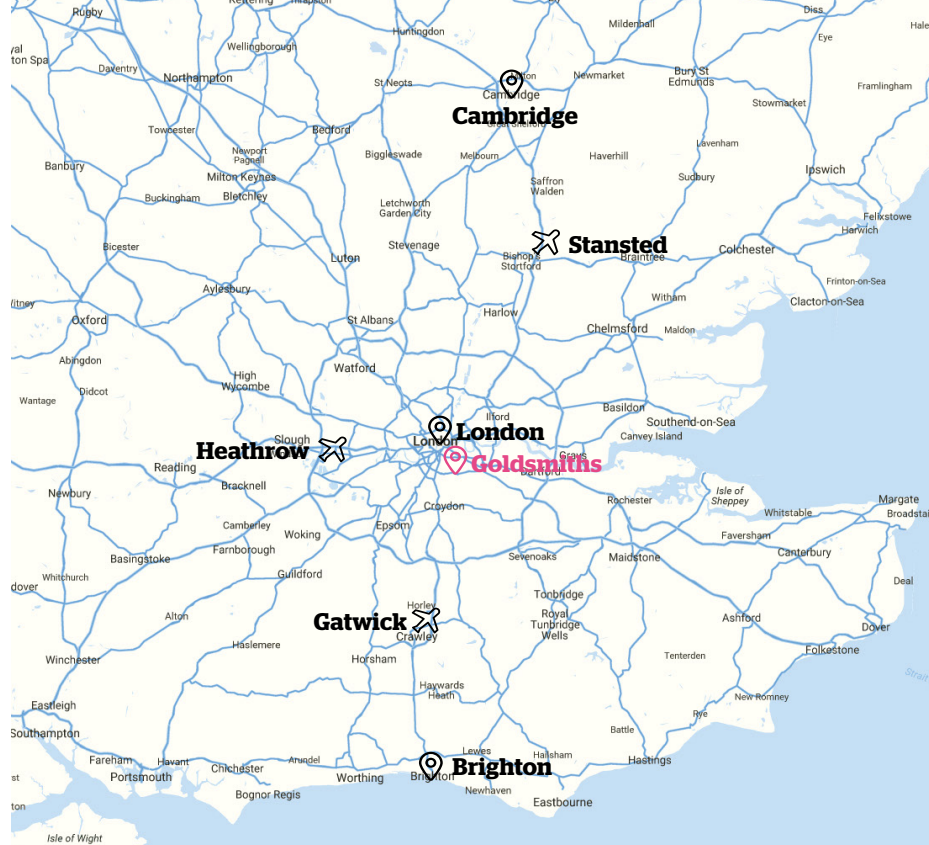
Sports: Netball and tennis courts are available with a large field perfect for football. An on-site gym is also available for group leaders who can enrol for a small fee.
