Meals

Breakfast: Toast, cereal, pastry, yoghurt, fruit. Cooked breakfast once per week.

Lunch: Pasta, meat or vegetarian main course with potatoes, vegetables, salad and dessert.

Accommodation

- Single rooms with a private bathroom, in flats of 6-8 rooms with a social space for students to relax in.
- The majority of the accommodation is located inside the campus with additional rooms available opposite the main site entrance.
- Spacious rooms with a desk and a chair.

Facilities

Sports: Sports are held in the beautiful Greenwich Park, which offers 74 hectares of open green space for outdoor games.

Other: We use a mixture of lecture theatres, classrooms and the Students Union on the Lower Deck within the Dreadnought building.

Heathrow: 1hr 20min

Gatwick: 1hr 40min

Groups are met at the airport by an Activity Leader who will welcome you and escort you to the campus.

Local area: South East London

Rail: 15min to central London from New Cross Gate.

Travelcards: Local transportation passes provided on all planned London excursions.

Security
