Zigzag Programmes (summer only)

Our UK residential and homestay programmes will run zigzag classes. This means that students will have some morning, some afternoon or even full-day lessons, mixed with weekday half and full day excursions. There may be some weekend lessons in some campuses too.

North American residential and homestay programmes may run on a zigzag according to arrival dates and student numbers. This will be advised upon booking.

Our winter camp in January in London runs a programme of alternating full day of lessons and full day London excursions. Programme may be zig-zagged depending on student numbers.

Lesson Schedule

(15 contact hours per week)

With our new syllabus, all Junior programmes teach 3 x 1-hour lessons of General English per day.


